And meanwhile, in the marquee, the tables are laid with particular attention to decoration...



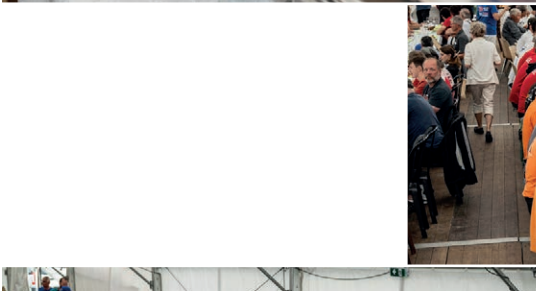


And outside, in the meantime groups are forming and discussions are going well...

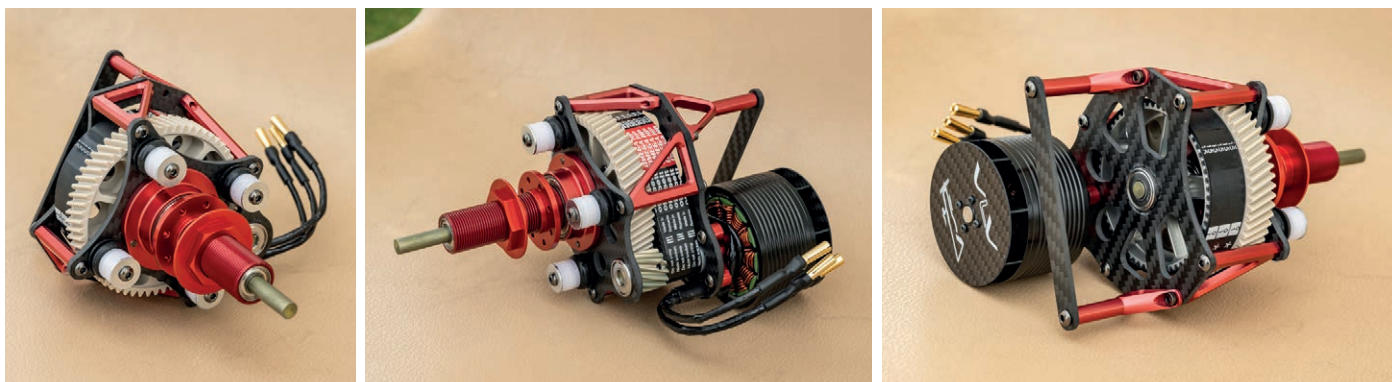
